

As families are faced with increasing financial challenges, the need to build our endowment is more critical than ever.


In an effort to accelerate endowment growth, one of our long-time faithful alumni has issued a \$1 million matching challenge to all UCA alumni and donors.

# MOLLY, MOLSTEADS, AND MEDICAL SCHOOL

---

Editor's Note: We generally feature a current student at Upper Columbia Academy who has received financial support from FoundationONE. We tell their story of the difference this is making in their life and their educational journey. We felt like for the summer issue we should feature a graduate of UCA who is currently fulfilling her commitment to the Eric Molstead Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship is one of 21 Named Scholarships managed by FoundationONE. The following is her story.

**M**olly Ahola graduated from UCA in 2020 and then on to Walla Walla University. She has just finished her first year of medical school at Loma Linda University, where she is studying to become an orthopedic surgeon.

Molly is one of the “Molstead Ladies”. Because of her interest and abilities in math and science, she was awarded the Eric Molstead Memorial Scholarship for the four years she attended UCA. This also addressed a financial need as Molly lost her dad in 2013. Having younger children, Molly’s mom was committed to staying at home to raise them. Because of the Molstead

scholarship, along with other financial aid, Molly and her sister Grace were able to afford four years at UCA, and by the end of her senior year her bill was completely paid off and she received her diploma. She remembers being amazed her family was able to do it! Molly says, “it was extremely meaningful that a family I didn’t even know was willing to offer me finan-

cial support.” When she first received the scholarship, she had no idea what it really meant – birthday and Christmas cards, the Molstead family attending many of her music performances and the Fox Christmas concert. It was not only the financial investment the Molsteads made, but their continued involvement in Molly’s life that was incredible, reaching even into her time at WWU.

As a freshman at UCA, Molly thought she wanted to go into social work, but when she received the scholarship, she wanted to honor the investment that was being made in her. She had always loved math and science, so it was an easy choice for her to take as many math and science classes as possible. She thoroughly enjoyed Mr. Hartman’s chemistry and physics classes. They really prepared her for what she faced at WWU. Mr. Gladding inspired her in the way he taught math and her love for the subject grew so much that she majored in math, planning on a career in engineering. However, after touring some engineering firms, she realized the “desk isolation” was not for her. She wanted to do something that had her interacting with people. Medical school was really a last-minute decision. And, because her analytical thinking was developed first at UCA and then WWU, she has been asked by upper classmen to work on various research projects where she was able to use her math and statistics skills as a first-year medical student.

Molly says, “I appreciate the criteria of the Molstead scholarship, because it supports specifically women.” Now that she is in medical school, she sees the low ratio of women in orthopedic surgery. This scholarship empowers young women today to pursue a career where math and science are emphasized.

I asked Molly what she would say to a donor who is considering giving to the FoundationONE Named Scholarship fund? She said, “it’s not just about the money, you are supporting an organization that inspires students’ success, and that’s even more important than the tuition assistance.” She said, “going to a high school that charges tuition is something a lot of people are unaccustomed to.” So, in cases like UCA, scholarships are invaluable. Molly would

encourage current and future students, wanting to enroll at UCA, to apply for the grants and Named Scholarships offered through FoundationONE. You wouldn’t think twice about applying for a scholarship in college because of the expense. These scholarships are about setting you up for success. You have nothing to lose! Molly is grateful for the scholarship she gets in medical school, based on both financial need and achievement. It’s essential!

Molly looks back on her educational journey and knows how blessed she was by the financial support she received from FoundationONE. She is so grateful for the Eric Molstead Scholarship and all the ongoing involvement and attention she receives from the Molsteads. What a blessing and a gift!



UCA is very grateful for the Classes of '66 – '71 who paid for the cost of redoing the roof on House #11 through their Faculty Homes Initiative.



The construction progress is on schedule for completion late this summer, and almost 75% of the funds have been raised. Several factors have combined to increase the final cost to \$1.75 million, but if we all give generously we can complete this urgent project debt free! Your generosity has enabled UCA to meet this urgent need with no impact to their yearly budget. Thank you!
