From 1st – 8th grades Mabel attended a local, non-SDA private school, and while she enjoyed many aspects of the educational program, she was occasionally bullied, and often felt like an outsider. There was also no music program, which was disappointing, as Mabel loves to sing.

Mabel first heard about attending UCA from her friend, Josie Littler, but wasn't planning on doing so until Sophie Miner, a friend from her Troy Church, told her that she would be coming to UCA the next year. She and Sophie have now roomed together for two years at UCA, and intend to continue doing so next year.

When Mabel talked with her parents about attending UCA, their immediate concern was the cost. In her parents words, "without FoundationONE, Mabel wouldn't be able to attend UCA. We have three daughters in Christian schools, and without financial aid, that would be impossible."

As happens with many students, UCA has become like a second home to Mabel. She enjoys the strong spiritual atmosphere at UCA, and how the students in general are very cheerful and happy. And after so many years in a school with no music program, she

greatly enjoys the opportunity to be involved in the choir at UCA, singing praises to God with her fellow students.

Mabel has worked in the Cafeteria for two years, earning the privilege of being a student supervisor for the '26-'27 school year. She says that she still enjoys "conquering" the messes in the dish room, but has proven herself a leader throughout the kitchen. In the words of Katelyn Johnson, Mabel's supervisor, "I can always count on her to be reliable, punctual, and efficient in her work. She approaches her work with enthusiasm, and is a genuine pleasure to work with every day!"

Stanley Seery was a hardworking mission pilot and airplane mechanic. He had great stories to tell of aviation adventures around the world. He loved his family and always showed up for them, whether attending their sports games, taking them to ice cream, or working on their cars. He was also a talented woodworker, creating beautifully crafted furniture and toys. Writing was not his forte, but fixing things was! If something broke, he was the man you wanted to have around! He was a dependable member of his local church, faithfully honoring God in his daily life and sending his children to Adventist schools. He was the kind of dad that his kids' friends called when they needed help; the kind of man who spent time with aging relatives and shouldered their responsibilities without complaint; the kind of grandfather who gave little ones "cowboy rides" on his knees. He could be counted on to be taking pictures at every special event—and the ordinary ones, too.



His family has created this scholarship to continue his legacy. Students who apply for the Stanley Seery scholarship don't need to have stellar grades — it is designed for kids who want to honor God by using their practical and mechanical skills to benefit the people around them.

CRITERIA: Recipients should be known as Christ-followers, hardworking, mechanically minded, and have financial need.

The UCA Honored Educators Scholarship Fund

The messages will be collected and printed in a booklet for the FoundationONE awards reception in the spring. For honored teachers who are still living, they will be invited to attend the reception in person in the spring or via Zoom, where they can be honored more directly.

As donor messages are collected they will also be shared in the Connections magazine for all of our readers to enjoy and be inspired by.

CRITERIA:

- Students who exemplify the characteristics of the educator being honored for traits such as: caring, nurturing, helpful, motivating, giving of self and time, kind, and insightful.
- Student recipient has made significant progress in their spiritual, academic or social lives because of the influence a UCA staff had in their life.
- Financial need.

DESSERT RECEPTION

Thursday evening, April 23, in the Dining Commons, at Upper Columbia Academy, we held the third annual awards reception for the Named Scholarship recipients. While sitting at linen-draped tables and enjoying delicious food, 67 students were awarded a total of \$107,500.00 in scholarships for the 2026-27 school year.

The evening was filled with lots of chatter between recipients, fund agents, and family members who were able to attend. It is a special time for the fund agents to meet and get better acquainted with their

student recipients. One fund agent described the evening like this: "It was a wonderful evening, and so meaningful! The décor was terrific, the set-up was amazing, and my overall impression of the event was: WONDERFUL!



This was my first time to attend, and I will hopefully be back every year!"

The UCA students look forward to this event, not only for the great food, but also because they know they will be receiving a well-deserved scholarship that will help them focus on their academic and spiritual growth rather than worry about how to pay for their education. One student who received a scholarship said, "Thank you for your assistance in helping me attend UCA! I came from a very violent public school, and that is why I moved to UCA. Because I have had such a wonderful experience here, I did not want my two younger brothers to have to stay in public school.

I was close to not coming back next year because my parents cannot afford to send all three of us to Christian schools (UCA & PCA). The scholarship you gave me encouraged my parents to give me another year at this amazing school. So, thank you for the blessing of another year that I can see Christ make an impact in my life, and where my younger brothers can be exposed to the Christ-centered environment at UCA."

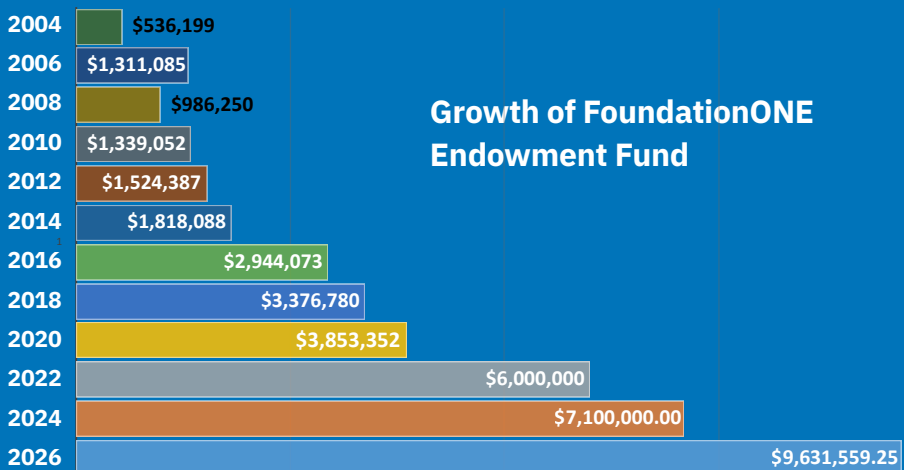

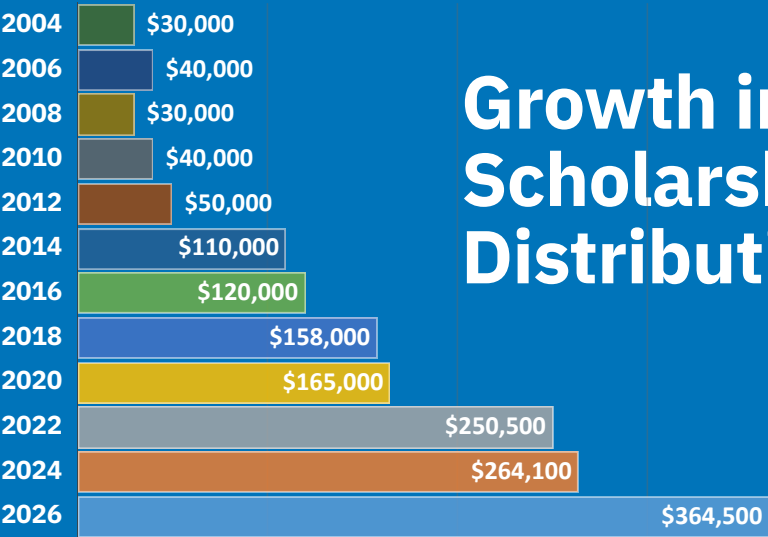

Pastor Fred & 30 Years of Pointing Students to Jesus

Teachers are an integral part of our lives – all of us! Whether home schooled, or traditional school, from kindergarten through high school and on to college, we’ve had the experience of listening to and learning from a teacher! Some teachers have impacted our lives to varying degrees, but one thing is for sure, we all have a story to tell about that “one” teacher that went above and beyond their job description for us.

FoundationONE has several Named Scholarships that honor a special teacher – the Olin Peach and Lois Coleman-Hall Scholarships, and our newest scholarship, the “Honored Educator Acknowledgement Fund”, which honors UCA teachers and the impact they have had in student’s lives.

The first teacher we highlight in this issue of Connection is Pastor Fred Riffel, affectionately known as “P Freddy”. Fred just finished his 30th year at UCA! He struggled with deciding between becoming a doctor or a pastor. The Iowa-Missouri Conference was pursuing Fred, but he eventually told them he was going to medical school. However, after making the choice, he felt no peace. In fact, he couldn’t sleep at night. Two weeks later, he began pastoring in St. Louis, MO, where he stayed for 7 ½ years. Following St. Louis, Pastor Fred went to Rockford, IL where he pastored for 3 ½ years. While pastoring, Fred was getting calls to academies from around the nation. Through the entire decision process of whether to leave pastoring for teaching, Fred gave the choice over to God. When UCA called, Fred went for an on-site visit. He was impressed with UCA’s entrance policy, which said, “if you are interested in having a growing friendship with Jesus, then you are welcome to attend UCA.” While hiking up to the “Rocks of Sharon”, just south of Spokane, Fred prayed God would guide him. God did

lay on Fred’s heart the conviction that UCA was where he should be. He was hired to be Chaplain, Bible teacher, and Recruiter.

I love Fred’s response to my question whether he prefers pastoring or teaching? He simply said, “My teaching is the greatest pastoring opportunity I could ever have. The point of UCA is to help students know God and see how He is working all around us. Who could ask for a better pastoring opportunity than that?”

“Youth are so hungry for truth – THE truth! They are willing to hear the truth real and raw when it’s presented in a caring, loving, trusting classroom. My goal is to help students taste and see that God is good, because He is! This is also my greatest challenge.”

Two aspects Pastor Fred appreciates about UCA are: the DNA of UCA has really become one of empowering and guiding students rather than controlling them, and second, the goal of disciplinary action is redemptive rather than punitive.

Boarding school offers a teacher many opportunities to be involved in activities and events outside of the classroom. Fred quickly realized that these are a way to get to know the students in a more personal and life-changing way. So over his 30 years, he’s led out in the Initiatives classes at Sr. Survival,



mission trips, the annual canoe trip to Upper Priest Lake and Rec Ski at Schweitzer. He's also coordinated the spring camping trip and ridden on the bus for the biology field trip to Rosario Beach. He has taken huge advantage of these trips to really connect with students for the purpose of strengthening their connection with Jesus.

When working with teenagers, it is important to be real with them. They can see inauthenticity a mile away. So, four of Fred's favorite phrases are: "I don't know", "I'm sorry", "Please forgive me", and "Come and see". UCA is blessed to have a teaching staff so dedicated and committed to helping teens not only see Jesus but meet Him and build a lasting relationship with Him. Pastor Fred lives this! Attached to his lectern, in his classroom, is a plaque that reads, "John 12:21, ...we would like to see Jesus." It stands as a reminder of what Fred's calling and commitment is to the students of UCA.

Some of Pastor Fred's former students were contacted and asked what it is that they remember about Fred. Here are just a couple of the responses:

"God has given Pastor Fred such a wonderful gift for relating to teenagers! I always felt like he understood what we were going through, and he sought to point us to Jesus. I can truly say that I know and love God more because of my time in his classes."

"Pastor Fred effortlessly balanced the roles of teacher, mentor, and friend. He was encouraging and supportive and kept it real. It's been nearly 20 years since graduation, and I still consider him a friend."
